

Ever wonder how crimes are solved in NH? Want to be a detective for a day? What does Hollywood get wrong or right about crime scene investigation? Dr. David J. "Lou" Ferland, Chief of Police (Ret.) will be here to talk about CSI techniques like interviewing, DNA, blood splatter analysis, fingerprints, crime labs, and peering into the criminal mind. Several "who-dun-its" will be presented for the audience to solve during the lecture!

Dr. Ferland was a police officer with the Portsmouth, NH Police Department for 30 years. He earned his Doctorate from Franklin Pierce University. His dissertation focused on the history of crime and punishment in the Portsmouth, NH Police Department. He is Executive Director of the United States Police Canine Association and Adjunct Professor for SNHU.

All Eyes Are Upon Us: Racial Struggles in the Northeast, from Jackie Robinson to Deval Patrick
Thursday, May 9th at 6:30pm at the Newmarket Public Library

From Brooklyn to Boston, World War II to the present, Jason Sokol traces the modern history of race and politics in the Northeast. Why did white fans come out to support Jackie Robinson as he broke baseball's color barrier while Brooklyn's blacks lived in segregated neighborhoods? How was African-American politician Ed Brooke of Massachusetts undone by the resistance to desegregation busing in Boston? Join us for this lecture and discussion - *Is the Northeast's history a microcosm of American as a whole: outwardly democratic, but inwardly conflicted over race?*

"Sketches of Lee" A Black American Experience
A Presentation and book preview by Michael C. Ward at the Newmarket Public Library
Saturday, May 11th at 1:30pm

Michael Ward began the story of his family with "A Colored Man in Exeter". We're excited to host Michael as he shares stories from the next volume. Traditionally, black families have maintained their oral histories over generations. The Wards of Lee, NH are no exception. The family left Brooklyn to escape gang violence, ending up on a dirt road in Lee. In doing so, they became the "Index of Integration" for Lee and the Oyster River School District. The Ward's experiences are captured in vivid detail and reflect how race affected Harold Ward's life and the progression of his family. In May 2015, Harold at age 94 was in declining health and asked Michael to write the stories of the family's existence. He wanted his "grand and great-grandchildren to know from whence they came". These stories are a direct, honest, and moving portrait of the Ward family.

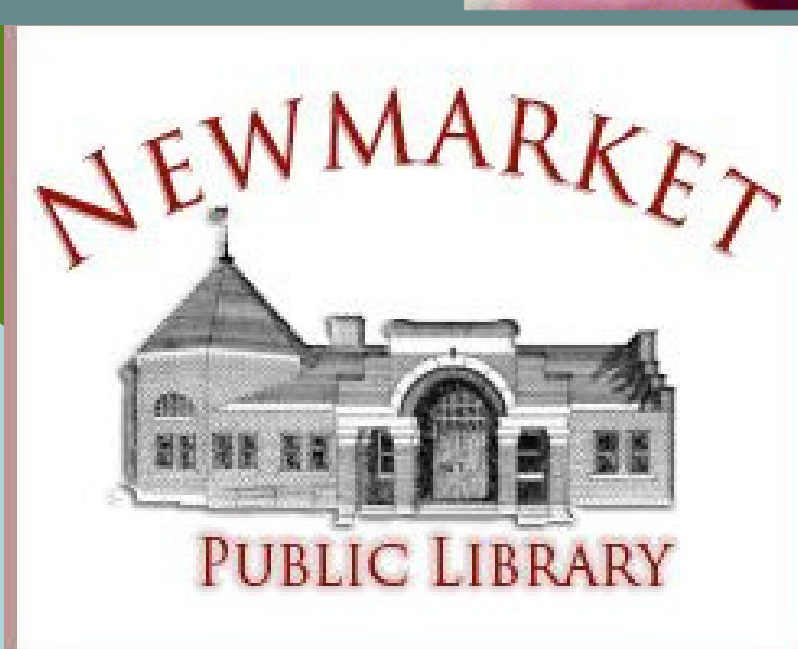
