

Michael Ward began the story of his family with "A Colored Man in Exeter". We're excited to host Michael as he shares stories from the next volume. Traditionally, black families have maintained their oral histories over generations. The Wards of Lee, NH are no exception. The family left Brooklyn to escape gang violence, ending up on a dirt road in Lee. In doing so, they became the "Index of Integration" for Lee and the Oyster River School District. The Ward's experiences are captured in vivid detail and reflect how race affected Harold Ward's life and the progression of his family. In May 2015, Harold at age 94 was in declining health and asked Michael to write the stories of the family's existence. He wanted his grand and great-grandchildren to know from whence they came". These stories are a direct, honest, and moving portrait of the Ward family.
